I write following your FOI request in which you request;

I would like to request a copy of the letters between yourself (Cleveland PCC and your office) and NPAS regarding the proposals to scrap NPAS tees valley.

I would also like to know if Mr Coppinger voted in favour of the new proposed model before or after writing to NPAS to highlight his concerns around response times.

This request has been handled under the Freedom of Information Act 2000.
