I write following your FOI request where you request:

Does your police force area have a dedicated illicit drugs officer/unit (as opposed to a Controlled Drugs Liaison Officers) whose sole responsibility is to coordinate:

- a) anti-drug possession operations
- b) anti-drug supplying operations?

Secondly, for the last five years for which figures are available, how many arrests have been for suspected offences under the Misuse of Drugs Act 1971.

This request has been handled under the Freedom of Information Act 2000.

Regarding your request I can now inform you that I have completed my enquiries and that my reply on behalf of the Office of the Police and Crime Commissioner for Cleveland is as follows.

I need to seek a clarification in your request.

Please can you clarify to me what you understand to be the difference between 'illicit' and 'controlled' drugs. An example would also be advantageous to help me respond to your query.
