REQUEST:

That the Police & Crime Commissioner determines the arrangements to be made in consequence of the notice of retirement of Chief Constable Jacqui Cheer.

Title:

Retirement of Chief Constable Cheer & Arrangements for Acting Chief Constable

Executive Summary:

Chief Constable Cheer has given notice of her intention to retire from the police service. Her last day of service will be 12 January 2016; by agreement, her last day in the office will be 6 January 2016.

The Police & Crime Commissioner has already approved the retirement proposal put forward by the Chief Constable and has determined that the appointment of a substantive Chief Constable ought properly to abide the completion of the forthcoming Police & Crime Commissioner elections.

By virtue of s41 Police Reform & Social Responsibility Act 2011, the role of Acting Chief Constable is adopted by the Deputy Chief Constable in the event of either or both of an absence or a vacancy in the substantive office of Chief Constable. In line with precedent (most recently Decision Record 62 – 2014) the Police & Crime Commissioner is invited to determine that

- with the approval of the Police & Crime Commissioner and by operation of law, during the absence and subsequent vacancy in the office of Chief Constable, Deputy Chief Constable lain Spittal will assume the role of Acting Chief Constable.
- these arrangements will commence at 00:01 on 7 January 2016 for so long as the vacancy subsists.

Decision:

- 1. To formally note the prior approval of the Police & Crime Commissioner for the retirement of Chief Constable Cheer
- 2. To approve the arrangements for Acting Chief Constable set out above to cater for the periods of absence and then vacancy in respect of the office of Chief Constable.
