<p>HMICFRS Inspection between 17 January and 25 February 2022.</p> <p>This inspection will examine the capability and capacity of forces to address serious youth violence and will consider how well police respond to violent crime involving young people, particularly between the ages of 14 to 24 years.</p> <p>It will assess:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> (a) how well the police address serious youth violence, investigate and support victims including where racial disproportionality may be a factor; (b) how effective and efficient the police are at working with partners to implement the serious violence strategy, including a public health approach; (c) how police led enforcement activities are supportive of partnership activities; and (d) how efficient and effective Violence Reduction Units are at reducing serious youth violent crime
