Title: Community Safety Initiative / Police Property Act Funding – July 2022 application review meeting

Executive Summary:

The PCC has funding available through a Community Safety Initiatives Fund and Police Property Act Fund. Applicants are welcome from an 'apply for funding' section of the PCC website. Applications are reviewed on a quarterly basis with the requirements for bids to link into the PCCs Police and Crime Plan.

The below decision follows an application review meeting in July 2022.

Decision:

To approve funding as set out below:

Breckon Hill Youthy - £13,526

Breckon Hill Community Enterprise aims to provide educational, recreational and social opportunities for residents of Middlesbrough and surrounding neighbourhood areas. This funding will be specifically used to deliver targeted, engagement diversionary activities, to a cohort of children and young people aged between 14 and 20.

Liverton Mines Youth Project - £1,500

To extend the current youth provision in the Liverton Mines areas to 4 nights per week.

Clean Slate Solutions - £19,250

Funding will be used to facilitate the delivery of tailored employability, and Information Advice and Guidance (IAG) workshops, for individuals who have left the criminal justice system and require support in obtaining long term employment opportunities.

The Moses Project - £10,000

This funding will be used to enable tailored mentoring via a Community Engagement Support Mentor to males from within the Stockton area who require supported rehabilitation.

Brake - £4,160

Specialist road safety literature including specialist support for victims of road traffic collisions.

River Safety Patrols - £1,850

To enable summer safety patrols and purchase of CCTV equipment, PPE / first aid materials.
